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Driving Innovation Through Quality Teaching Rounds

Based on the work and research of educators at Newcastle University's School of Education, this branch of our project will be based on objective observations of school and classroom practice, utilising Quality Teaching elements, to inform and improve decision-making. Key to this is the development of a common understanding and common language used across all our school contexts. Using observation teams incorporating representatives from across all school contexts allows for a shared understanding of leadership and a concerted approach to building consistency of approach across all educational contexts.

We are looking forward to welcoming 33 of you here to Turramurra next Monday and Wednesday. Jeff has also arranged to link in to the regional schools who are involved via Adobe Connect. This is a really exciting part of the project which has generated a lot of interest from schools. It will provide us with a very sound tool to analyse teaching and learning practice within and between our schools.

Development of professional learning module -
You might remember from our original grant application, that there are two parts to the PPDP project. There is the professional learning which we have done and are continuing to do as we embed the processes and strategies that we explored at our Magenta Shires conference. It has been so exciting to see how each school or group of schools has found an aspect relevant to their context and pursued it. The second part of the PPDP project is to actually use our learning experiences to develop a "professional learning module" which can be picked up and used by Principals and leaders around the state who want resources to develop innovation and collaboration in their schools.
